A passage from John is always read on this Sunday. This year, it's the first of Jesus' signs. Turning water into wine has nothing to do with the wedding; it is a sign demonstrating the power of Jesus' word to transform the human condition. Notice that he, the Word -made -flesh, does not actually do anything: his Word has power. His mother has implicit trust in the Word: she tells the servants: do what ever he tells you."

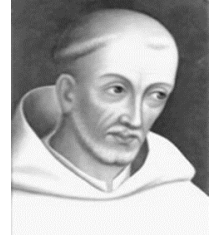
